


INSTRUCTIONS FOR BARGELLO

Bargello is usually worked vertically over an even number of threads, commonly four horizontal threads; this is called Florentine Stitch. Each new stitch is usually moved up or down by two threads forming a wave like pattern. The size of the wave may be varied according to the number of stitches in each repeated section of the pattern and the number of canvas threads covered by each stitch.





FIRST ROW

Bring the needle through at 1, insert at 2 and out again at 3. Depending on the pattern you can start the next stitch up or down two or more of the material threads. Insert at 4 and repeat the pattern.

SECOND ROW

The second row repeats the pattern above or below the first row of stitches in a different colour.



FINISHING OFF

To finish off your thread run the needle through the back of four or five stitches and trim the thread close to the cloth.
